### Speak out on Domestic Servitude – Sgt Khizra

Sgt. Khizra implores Nigerians in UK to always strive to obey the laws of our host country, do everything to support the good, British government

The Nigerian Community has been urged to be careful of how they 'employ' people to work for them. According to the Domestic Servitude Coordinator, of West Midlands Police, Birmingham, Sergent Khizra, it is illegal to just employ anyone, without proper documentation and paying less than the British Government approved, minimum wage.

Speaking at the quarterly Central Executive Council (CEC) meeting of the National Association of Nigerian Communities (NANC), hosted by the United Nigeria Welfare Association, (UNIWA) Birmingham, Sergent Khizra stated that it is against British laws to enslave anyone, under the guise of providing employment. According to her, 'even if the individual was sent with the consent of parents or relatives, as long as they are not registered and remunerated properly according to UK laws, there will be a penalty to pay.

She further said, the British Government, has put in place welfare package to help those who are found to be in this position and offenders will be prosecuted with long jail terms expected.

Responding to this, NANC President, Seyi Obadare, implored Nigerians in UK to always strive to obey the laws of our host country, do everything to support the good, British government is strenuously trying to make out of United Kingdom.

Our children also did us proud. We heard about experiences of Nigeria, an award winning poem




